The WWII Battle of Midway, June 4-7, 1942

Midway Atoll, 1,300 miles northwest of Hawaii, was vital during WWII as a refueling point and became the site of a pivotal U.S.-Japan battle. Despite Japan's superior fleet and experienced pilots, U.S. cryptographers uncovered their strategy, leading to a decisive American victory. What lessons can we learn from Midway's impact on morale, strategy, and leadership?

The American Battle Monuments Foundation is the non-profit partner of the American Battle Monuments Commission, the U.S. agency responsible for all 26 American military cemeteries and 31 monuments overseas. Nearly 234,000 American service men and women are buried or memorialized (remains missing) at ABMC hallowed sites.
